CORBY UPDATES



Motorcycle ASB

As part of **Operation Pacify**, the local team continue to make significant progress tackling motorcycle nuisance. The team are involved in ongoing investigations to gain intel through phones and work with motorcycle companies for tracking information for warrants. 3 warrants have been issued, multiple people are on bail for offences awaiting sentencing, and 3 outcall dispersals for damage caused by riding motorcycles in a local nature reserve.

Tackling ASB

Officers in Corby are targeting ASB in the town centre as part of Operation Alien. The team have crewed up with town centre security and the retail crime team to tackle shoplifting, and have identified 5 key young people involved in this behaviour. These individuals have been involved in assaults, criminal damage, commercial burglary and possession of drugs. Since Op Alien, there has been a significant reduction of ASB in the town centre with more than 30 young people identified by the team. They continue to work with local government and the youth offending service to tackle this behaviour. Dispersal powers have been used on four occasions to tackle street drinking and suspected drug dealing. The team are working with trading standards to visit shops who continue supplying alcohol to those already intoxicated, who will lose their license if caught. We all want to keep our community safe, so please continue to report ASB online here.

Retail Crime

A <u>34-year-old Corby man</u> has been banned from specific areas of Corby, including the town centre and Willows Place Shopping Centre, due to his involvement in persistent anti-social and illegal behaviour.

Retailers across Northamptonshire are being encouraged to join the county's business crime partnership to prevent, disrupt and deter retail crime and anti-social behaviour in town centres and retail areas. More information is available <u>here</u>.

GENERAL UPDATES



Op Snap

This scheme allows the public to submit dashcam evidence online regarding road offences within 14 days of the offence. The team **can only accept video footage.** They will then prosecute the driver with a notice of intended prosecution.

In February 2025, there were 154 submissions to Op Snap. You can submit your footage here <u>Northamptonshire Police</u> <u>Operation Snap</u>.

How do I report speeding?

If you are concerned about speeding, you should contact your neighbourhood policing team. You can also report driving offences online here <u>Report a road traffic incident |</u>. <u>Northamptonshire Police</u>.

Your PCSOs have received speed enforcement training and can use the speed guns if you report speeding concerns on a certain road/area. PCs have the power to stop and deal with vehicles at the roadside who can educate drivers or prosecute them with a ticket. PCSOs can give out warning letters to drivers caught and will then pass on their reports to the safer roads team.
