#### Scam advice- doorstep sellers

There have been concerns reported regarding doorstep sellers in your area. Rogue traders or distraction burglars target elderly and vulnerable people, so your team are reaching out to provide advice and tips of what to look out for and stay safe. Please reach out to your team or attend a community surgery to talk to your officers if you are worried about this. More information is available <u>here</u>.

#### **Residential Burglary**

### Tips and advice from your neighbourhood team

- Burglars often break in at the rear of properties. Ensure your rear garden is secure at all times with 1.8m perimeter fence/wall/gate and keep all gates locked
- Make sure the front of your property is easily seen – fences and hedges should not be more than 1 metre high
- Install dusk to dawn lighting above your front door
- Keep your doors locked at all times so many burglars just walk in – don't make it easy for them!
- If you're not in the room, close the window
- Make sure your house looks occupied, leave lights on when you're out. Use timer switches for when you're away

If you're worried about burglary in your area, please reach out to your local team who can offer you advice and support.

#### Working with schools

Local officer Dan Freeman attended Parklands Primary for world book day to engage with young children in the community and read them a story. The children really enjoyed having a chance to engage with the police and learn about all the hard work the Northampton team do in their community. It is really positive to show to young people that the police are approachable and are there to keep them safe.



# **GENERAL UPDATES**



#### **Op Snap**

This scheme allows the public to submit dashcam evidence online regarding road offences within 14 days of the offence. The team **can only accept video footage.** They will then prosecute the driver with a notice of intended prosecution.

In February 2025, there were 154 submissions to Op Snap. You can submit your footage here <u>Northamptonshire Police</u> <u>Operation Snap</u>.

#### How do I report speeding?

If you are concerned about speeding, you should contact your neighbourhood policing team first. You can also report driving offences online here <u>Report a road traffic incident | Northamptonshire Police</u>.

Your PCSOs have received speed enforcement training and can use the speed guns if you report speeding concerns on a certain road/area. PCs have the power to stop and deal with vehicles at the roadside who can educate drivers or prosecute them with a ticket. PCSOs can give out warning letters to drivers caught and will then pass on their reports to the safer roads team.
