



Advice on the use of CCTV in your home

CCTV systems at home can help Police to identify individuals who are engaging in anti-social behaviour and secure convictions. It can be a reassuring presence to help fight against crime.

CCTV in your home

Domestic CCTV systems are now widely available, and many can link to your smartphone or tablet to allow you to view your property from anywhere. If you are interested in installing CCTV, it is important you know and understand the laws and regulations. When positioning the cameras, owners should ensure, where possible, that they only capture their own property. If this isn't possible and the CCTV captures someone else's property, a public area or communal space, then data protection law applies, as it counts as personal information. If you intend to install CCTV, it is recommended to discuss this with your neighbours beforehand, as they may have privacy concerns.
