EAST NORTHANTS UPDATES



Garden/Farm break ins

The team are receiving an increase of reports in East Northants for garden/farm break ins. Suspects are taking differing equipment ranging from horse tack, battery and mains powered tools for gardens and workshops, ride on mowers, trailers, quads, ATV's, compact tractors and everything in between.

Advice from the rural crime team

- Make sure your items and equipment are locked up
- Chain large items together where possible and block them in with bigger kit
- Take keys out and store them away from machines
- Report ANY suspicious vehicles
- Report changes to gates and locks (we are seeing padlocks cut and then suspects putting their own locks back on to allow future access)

Suspicious vehicles

If there are any suspicious circumstances or if a crime is in progress, please report immediately on 999 and, if you can and without putting yourself at any risk, attempt to obtain index numbers of any vehicles seen.

If you do get any vehicle index numbers please report this immediately to our dedicated Northants team on 101 to maximise our chances of identifying suspect vehicles.

Community surgeries

Your team regularly hold community surgeries in East Northants which give you the chance to meet your PCSO in person, and discuss any crime concerns you may have. Details of these surgeries are advertised in advance and you can see upcoming events on your local area page [here](#). The officers would like to thank everyone who has attended a surgery. They are receiving a significant amount of information about uninsured drivers and nuisance motorcycles. This information is passed on to the safer roads team who keep your roads and your community safe.

How do I report speeding?

If you are concerned about speeding, you should contact your neighbourhood policing team first. You can also report driving offences online here [Report a road traffic incident](#) | [Northamptonshire Police](#).

Your PCSOs have received speed enforcement training and can use the speed guns if you report speeding concerns on a certain road/area. PCs have the power to stop and deal with vehicles at the roadside who can educate drivers or prosecute them with a ticket. PCSOs can give out warning letters to drivers caught and will then pass on their reports to the safer roads team.

Op Snap

This scheme allows the public to submit dashcam evidence online regarding road offences within 14 days of the offence. The team **can only accept video footage**. They will then prosecute the driver with a notice of intended prosecution.
